The magnetic board depicts several types of weather. The children choose clothes from the cupboard and put them on the characters in the story.

More information

Different clothes protect us from different weather conditions.

New fabrics have been designed to specifically protect us from the sun, wind and very cold temperatures.

Learning outcomes

In this activity, children will:

- describe their activities and observations
- participate in very simple investigations involving observation
- sort objects according to basic criteria and apply them to real-life situations
- support their views and conclusions by using evidence
- use their storytelling and observation skills, to create a story.

Pre-visit questions

1. What do you think these children are doing?
2. In which picture is it sunny? What clues did you use to work this out?
3. In which picture is it windy? What clues did you use to work this out?
4. In which picture is it rainy? What clues did you use to work this out?
5. What clothes do you wear on windy/sunny/rainy days?

Post-visit questions

1. Name the different clothing items you would use on a rainy/cold/sunny day.
2. What is an umbrella used for?
3. Why do people wear hats?

During your visit

- Encourage children to dress the people in each story panel according to the weather conditions.
- Encourage children to make-up a story to tell you, based on the characters on the board.
