What's it made from?

Description of photo

Foods and everyday items found in the café are displayed on the front of each flap and the child can open each one to find what it is made from.

More information

These include:

- Eggs (chickens)
- Bacon (pigs)
- Popcorn (corn)
- Chips (potatoes)
- Fish fingers (fish)
- Juice (pineapple, orange)
- Teabag (leaves)
- Coffee (beans)
- Milk (cow)
- Glass (sand)
- Serviette (wool)
- Jam (strawberries, sugar)

Living in the city we sometimes forget the processing that takes place between the farm and our tables.

Learning outcomes

In this activity, children will:

- use their senses to explore the world around them
- describe their activities and observations using both general and science-specific language
- participate in very simple investigations involving observations
- make predictions and test them
- sort objects according to basic criteria.

Pre-visit questions

1. What do you think the child is doing?
2. What food can you see in this picture?
3. What might be inside each box?
4. What foods do you like?

Post-visit questions

1. Can you remember what glass/paper napkins/chips are made from?
2. Discuss how foods are processed (changed) to make new foods. (e.g. cooking/chopping).
3. Which foods come from animals?

During your visit

- Encourage children to predict what might be inside the box before opening each flap.
- Talk about the way each item is processed to create new products.
- Ask children to tell you which of the foods come from animals or plants.
